The Swings ~ El Columpio

- The swing goes up and down
 Arriba y abajo va el columpio

 Forwards forwards
 Adelante adelante

 Low low low, Bajo bajo bajo

 Me gusta, me gusta,
 El columpio

Suggested actions and movement



- 1 Swing arms up high in front of the body, then bring them down low bending the knees at the same time.
- 2 Turn to one side Swing arms out in front and step forwards, then move arms back and rock back on one foot to show backwards movement.
- 3 Swing arms up across the body and reach up high, then swing then down and crouch on the ground.



Repeat actions from all three verses one after the other then make a heart shape with your hands and swing en el columpio.

Suggested adaptations

Enjoy lifting baby up and down, moving forwards and backwards while cradling them, then high and low in your arms.

Sitting babies

Sit with baby in front of you and perform the actions holding their hands and gently guiding them along with the actions.

Encourage them to lift their arms independently once they're used to the actions.





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Why not try...

Swing alphabet

El alfabete del columpio

On a visit to the playground ~ el parque infantíl, engage little one's brains with a game while they're swinging!

Get them to say the letter of the alphabet on each forwards and backwards movement, then challenge them to spot something in the park that starts with each letter. Give a countdown to keep the game moving and if they can't find something beginning with that letter, then they can pass by saying 'pasa' on to the next letter.

This game can be adapted for younger children by the adult saying the letters of the alphabet to get the children to copy. And if you know it in Spanish, it's the perfect time to practice and for them to learn it too.
